

NBC NEWS SURVEY CONDUCTED APRIL 14-18, 2023





"Unless either former President Trump or President Biden have an adverse health event forcing them to terminate their campaign, we are going to have a Trump-Biden rematch, whether the parties or the public prefer it or not."


Polls have Biden narrowly favored against the two top GOP candidates


"What is unique about the distinct possibility of a Biden-Trump matchup in November 2024 is that it would be the first time since 1892 that a sitting president defends the office against his immediate predecessor, inviting a comparison of how each handled the economy. This is obviously the ground on which Trump would prefer to fight, whereas the Biden camp would argue that the circumstances that exist in his tenure are completely different from those during the four years when Trump was president."

Trump holds a strong lead in 2024 Republican presidential nomination polls



"...the advantages that Trump starts off with are massive, chief among them total name recognition and high favorability ratings among his fellow Republicans. People are often reluctant to cast a ballot for someone that they have never heard of or have little familiarity with. Last month's CNN poll showed 71 percent of Republicans nationally have a favorable opinion of Trump. Even when Republican-leaning independents are added into the mix, his favorable rating is 65 percent... A statewide poll taken at the beginning of this month in Florida, where Trump and DeSantis are both well known and defined, showed Trump beating DeSantis by 20 points, 50 to 30 percent with 7 percent undecided and six other candidates clustered in the low single digits with a combined 14 points of support."

The numbers that show Trump's strength

"There are few if any meaningful signs that Trump's grip on the GOP nomination is loosening. If the 45th president is nominated again, the case that he cannot win a general election seems to ignore both President Biden's own vulnerabilities and the simple fact that the Democratic vote is so inefficiently spread out... Basically, a Democrat must win the national popular vote with at least 4 or 5 points to spare, equal or greater than the margin of error in most national polls."
